

Safeguarding Guidance for Out-of-School Settings

What are Out-of-School settings.

Overview

- Applies to extracurricular activities, tuition, and clubs for children outside school hours
 - Covers best practices for safeguarding and promoting child welfare
 - Key areas covered:
 - Safeguarding and child protection policies and procedures
 - Ensuring the suitability of staff members and volunteers
 - Having proper health and safety policies and risk assessments
 - Clear governance structure and accountability
 - Other relevant considerations like data protection
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Safeguarding Measures.

- Have a child protection policy outlining procedures
 - Handling different types of abuse
 - Reporting concerns and making referrals
 - Designate safeguarding lead to handle concerns
 - Staff and volunteer training
 - Child protection, risks like exploitation
 - First aid, health, and safety
 - Parental consent forms with emergency contacts and medical info
 - Store securely following data protection rules
 - Staff vetting, including DBS, identity, and reference checks
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Staff and Volunteers

- Pre-employment checks - ID, references, DBS, right to work
 - Ongoing reviews after appointment
 - Performance, and training needs
 - Protect children from unsafe staff
 - Allegations procedures, suspensions, referrals
 - Ensure staff understand whistleblowing and complaints policies
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Health and Safety

- Appoint a person responsible for first aid provision
 - Have fire safety procedures and evacuation plan
 - Obtain parental emergency contacts and medical information
 - Assess and reduce risks
 - Policies, risk assessments, regular reviews
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Other Considerations

- Verify safeguarding measures if using school or local authority premises
 - Have policies to identify and manage issues like radicalization
 - Get parental consent for photographs, videos, overnight stays
 - Follow data protection rules and food safety requirements
 - Ensure accessibility and support for children with SEND
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
